





Many countries celebrate their Teachers' Day on 5 October in conjunction with World Teachers' Day, which was established by UNESCO in 1994.






Teacher's Day is a special day for the appreciation of teachers, and may include celebrations to honor them for their special contributions in a particular field area or the community tone in education.

#### WHAT?

Halloween is a holiday celebrated all around the world.

#### HISTORY OF HALLOWEEN

Halloween is a Celtic celebration called Samhain /sah-wen/. Samhain marked the end of summer and the end of summer harvest.

Ancient Celtics were very superstitious and they believed that on October the 31<sup>st</sup>, the spirits of the dead came back to towns and villages. To keep these spirits away, they dressed up in scary costumes made from animal skins. They also made noise in streets and fired up huge bonfires.

#### JACK O' LANTERNS

According to an old tale, a drunken farmer named Stingy Jack was not allowed to enter both heaven and hell after his death. His soul wandered in the darkness. He carved out a lantern out of a turnip to light his way and guide his soul.

The Celtics believed in this story of Jack Stingy, so they began to place Jack o' Lanterns outside their houses. The purpose was to guide lost souls home while they wandered during the Samhain festival eve.

- The traditional colours of Halloween are black and orange.
   Orange comes from the autumn harvest and black represents death.
- Cats, spiders and bats are Halloween icons because they were believed to be witches servants in the past.

Use battery-operated candles, flashlights, or glow sticks in your jack-o-lanterns and keep your home's exits clear of decorations.


# Thanksgiving Day. History.

A legendary Thanksgiving celebration was held in 1621. The terrible winter of the previous year had been difficult for the Pilgrims. Many of the Pilgrims had died because of illness and lack of shelter. The Thanksgiving celebration was held after the Pilgrims had their first harvest--after they had gathered their first crops.

The writings of the Pilgrims tell us that about 140 people attended the three-day celebration. Ninety of the people were Wampanoag men.

About 50 people were Pilgrims. Only four of the Pilgrims at the party were women. The feast was held outside because the Pilgrims did not have a building large enough to hold so many people.


The Pilgrims were thankful for the harvest and for the help of the Wampanoag in teaching them to grow crops in America. Without their help, the Pilgrims would have had little to eat. The menu for the first Thanksgiving included venison, or deer meat, and fowl, which included ducks, geese, and turkeys. Sea bass, cod fish, cornmeal, fruits and vegetables were also served.





After debates the school held a vote. The students impartially chose who to vote for.




According to the results of the voting, Alexander Potapov became the president of the school government.

#### Miraculous: Ladybug & Cat Noir.

The Movie is a 2023 French animated musical romantic superhero film directed and co-written by Jeremy Zag. It is an adaptation of the animated television series Miraculous: Tales of Ladybug & Cat Noir.

Ladybug & Cat Noir: The Movie premiered at the Grand Rex on 11 June 2023, and was released in France on 5 July 2023, by SND. Internationally, it was released theatrically from the same date onwards in select regions, and was released on 28 July 2023 on Netflix in others.

The film follows two Parisian teenagers, Marinette Dupain-Cheng and Adrien Agreste, who transform into the superheroes Ladybug and Cat Noir, respectively, to protect the city from supervillains led by Hawk Moth.

It would seem to be a classic story of first love, but these guys are not at all who they say they are. When the city is threatened, Marinette transforms into the superheroine Ladybug and Adrien transforms into Super Cat. Their incredible abilities help fight evil, but none of them know who is really hiding behind the mask.
