Ancient Celtics were very superstitious and they believed that on October the 31<sup>st</sup>, the spirits of the dead came back to towns and villages. To keep these spirits away, they dressed up in scary costumes made from animal skins. They also made noise in streets and fired up huge bonfires.

#### JACK O' LANTERNS

According to an old tale, a drunken farmer named Stingy Jack was not allowed to enter both heaven and hell after his death. His soul wandered in the darkness. He carved out a lantern out of a turnip to light his way and guide his soul.

The Celtics believed in this story of Jack Stingy, so they began to place Jack o' Lanterns outside their houses. The purpose was to guide lost souls home while they wandered during the Samhain festival eve.
